CHURCH COUNCIL MESSAGE Ray Ihlenburg, President

Dear JOY members,

COUNCIL

On March 2nd we will have our first Town Hall of 2025. There are several items of interest on the agenda including a short update on the 2-5 year plan and the security efforts we have employed, mainly the decision to lock our doors during our worship services. This is a topic of angst both for and against. It is a shame that we cannot go back to the days of our childhood and keep our doors open at all times, however, today's society and the propensity for evil, says that we cannot. If we believe we should not lock our doors to provide security for our gatherings, are we presuming we are not at risk?

The formation of the Safety and Security Task Force was based on the following verses: <u>Proverbs 22:3 "A wise man sees danger and prepares for it" and Acts 20:28 "Set a watch</u> <u>over yourselves and the flock".</u> Some questions to ponder before the Town Hall:

If we are <u>not at risk</u>, why do we use video surveillance for our office and church buildings to monitor who enters and leaves our buildings? Why do we not leave our Sanctuary open all the time? Why do we have a security system at all?

If we agree that we <u>are at risk</u> in our modern society, then are we not responsible for keeping those who enter our buildings safe? Every other congregation along the Hwy 200 corridor contacted by the Joy security team has security and lock their doors to protect their congregation.

A welcoming environment does not mean a defenseless one. Therefore, I propose that we focus our energy on the discussion as to how we can provide a welcoming environment in spite of our need to have our doors locked. Let's talk about how we can be welcoming to those who enter our buildings, but also provide a safe place for them to worship.



If you signed up to bring food, please bring it with you to the Lodge.


