# COUNCIL

### JOY COUNCIL NEWS February 2024

The Volunteer Appreciation Dinner on Saturday evening February 11<sup>th</sup> was a resounding success. The venue, the food, the attendees, and the entertainment were all an event planner could possibly ask for. Thank you all for coming and enjoying this great evening with your Joy family. The band, 'Uniqulele' (Oo-niq-oo-lele) complemented us saying they have never really played for an audience as attentive and supportive as the JOY Folks. I have a feeling we'll be seeing and hearing them again.

It is a pleasure to report that the sidewalk improvement project has received approval from Marion County and is scheduled to begin on April 22.

The Council, at their February meeting, considered several recommendations from the Property Ministry. The following recommendations were approved by Council, following the Finance Ministry's review, input, and approvals.

We have a most unexpected expenditure concerning our oldest air conditioner for the Sanctuary. It has been determined it is not repairable and must be replaced. The estimated cost is \$37,750. The upcoming Congregational meeting on March 3 at 9:45 am is required according to our Constitution because this amount is more than 10% of the annual budget. However, thanks to the generosity of our congregation through specific gifts and pledges, we have been able to budget the necessary funds to make this investment. Please keep in mind, we are in the very early months of the annual budget so it is extremely important that our pledges continue to be met. A Lenten offering to the building fund or the maintenance fund would be such benevolent means to support Joy.

In other news, in the near future, needed safety improvements will be taking place in the parking lots. New LED bulbs will be installed in the existing fixtures and there will be photocell controls that will automatically turn the lights on and off. Also, the wall sconce lamps next to the Sanctuary doors are under study to replace with new fixtures utilizing LED bulbs. These improvements will enhance the safety of our campus after dark.

Finally, Council focused on the driveway at JOY Home (foster home). It is in very bad shape and has the potential to damage staff's vehicles. The Property Ministry recommended repairs totaling \$3,000; Financing will assess the cost against the rental income, and Council has approved this expenditure.

The next bit of news is COST FREE – Please Save the date and attend: There will be a free AED training session conducted by the OTOW Safety Director on April 4<sup>th</sup> from 2 to 4 pm. This event will be hosted at the Candler Lodge, where the Volunteer Appreciation Dinner was held. It is open to outside guests from Joy. Just contact Ray Ihlenburg for a reservation or sign up on the bulletin board in the hallway. All OTOW residents will be hearing from their Joy Shepherd and asked to attend. This is the single most important item we have control over to provide a safe place at Joy.
