CHURCH COUNCIL MESSAGE

COUNCIL

Dear JOY members,

March has gone by so fast. Remember back on March 2nd we held the first Town Hall of 2025. One topic of interest to all JOY's members was the presentation of 'need' for expansion based on attendance, and ability based on 'financial' limitation. Guidance for expansion for more worship space typically recommends to begin planning when attendance at all services reaches 80% and developing construction documents when attendance approaches 90%. According to Pastor Art's most recent membership review, we have 395 members, however, the average attendance, including non-members and visitors for 2024 was 112 with the maximum for one service was 163 on Commitment Sunday. Another interesting attendance number is highest attendance stands at 211. When comparing this to available seats of 250 chairs, the Steering Committee agrees we are well below that 80% rule-of-thumb when planning for expansion becomes necessary.

Our second guiding factor is financial. The Council and Finance Ministry decided to continue to save an amount equal to our retired mortgage payment or \$5,000 each month for future expansion needs. A simple analysis indicates that if we expand and must mortgage the construction, \$5,000 per month supports a project cost of approximately \$700,000.

This all begs the question, "just what is our most pressing need as a congregation?" Fellowship space for all worshipers seems to be the answer for our focus. In the coming months, the Steering Committee will be scheduling a meeting to present their findings and conceptual recommendation.

Most pressing at JOY is the scheduled work day to take care of the land scaping around the Church. On April 5 beginning at 8:30 am please come help spread 150 bales of pine needles. Weeding and spraying takes place continuously but the pine needles really help slow the new weeds. Their acidity also helps to make our azaleas bloom so beautifully. There will be other small jobs to do but spreading the pine needles is most labor intensive. Please help for an hour or two.
