#### **HOW DO YOU GIVE TO JOY?**

There are several ways you can make your donations:

Credit/Debit Card, Automatic Bank Bill Payment, QCD, and Checks.

Please consider the following:

- 1. Credit/Debit Card payments may involve fees that are assessed to you as well as to the church.
- 2. Auto Bill Pay is a check sent from your bank directly to the church as specified by you. As of this date, there are no fees assessed.
- 3. QCD You can make a Qualified Charitable Distribution as part of your annual Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA. A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from an IRA custodian, payable to the church. Amounts distributed as a QCD can be excluded from your taxable income.
- 4. Checks can be mailed in or placed in the offertory envelopes provided by Joy.

The boxed envelopes provided are specifically designed to be used weekly, on holidays, and special collections.

Please consider whether the weekly offertory envelopes meet your specific donation needs (Donate monthly, semi-annually, or annually.) If they do not you can decide not to use them and use a pew envelope for your donation. (Remember to put your name on the envelope.)

Should you decide not to use the weekly envelopes, please notify the office so we can amend our records. The envelopes are expensive therefore any reduction in how many we must order would be a large cost savings for Joy.

#### WHAT HAPPENED BETWEEN THE TESTAMENTS?

The Old Testament ends with the book of Malachi, written around 430 B.C. The New Testament picks up around 60 A.D, chronicling Jesus birth approximately 5-3 B.C.

As Malachi ended, the Israelites were subject to the Persians, who allowed the Israelites religious freedom. Then Alexander the Great took charge. Because of this, Greek became the universal language. The Old Testament was translated into Greek, making it accessible to the people.

After Alexander died, a general named Ptolemy was in charge of Palestine. He and the heirs who followed treated the Israelites well, but not the kings of Syria, known as the Seleucids. One of these leaders, Antiochus IV, tried to force the Israelites to give up their religion, using torture and other means.

Hope arrived with the Maccabean revolt, initially led by a priest named Mattathias and carried on by his son Judas, a military genius. For about one hundred years (roughly 167-63 BC), the Israelites were independent. Then the Roman general Pompey "annexed" Palestine, making it part of the Roman Empire. Eventually Herod the Great, a tyrant, came to power (38 BC). He was in charge at the beginning of the New Testament.


