We have the greatest gift to give them, which is the love of Christ! It goes beyond attractional, entertaining worship. We are well known for our warm and welcoming atmosphere. You are good, loving people, filled with the Holy Spirit. God can work with that! We (I) sell ourselves short too often.

The "nones" will be drawn to authenticity, depth, sensitivity, and inclusion. I don't believe we need to compete with other churches for "market share" in this rapidly growing Liberty Triangle (SR 200 "corridor"). But we can still invite and engage in the four L's. As guests come to concerts, worship, Bible classes, and groups, opportunities are served up on Jesus' silver platter. May the Holy Spirit guide you and me through worship, fellowship and service to reach out to the Kasons and Charlottes who seem hungering and thirsting for the living God.




